News from the APHA:

Renowned equine artist Orren Marion Mixer died April 29. He was 87. A long-time friend of APHA, Mixer's art graces the walls of the Fort Worth headquarters, as well as numerous covers of the *Paint Horse Journal*.

His well-known painting of APHA's first All-Around Champion, Yellow Mount, has long been recognized as an icon of the American Paint Horse breed. Not only did it too, grace the cover of the *Journal*, it has also been seen at a variety of APHA events and in an assortment of books, magazines and publications.

Mixer was born in Oklahoma City in 1920 to Florence Motter and Orren Marion Mixer Sr. After attending public schools, he graduated from Central High School and through the efforts of his high school art teacher, Grace Chadwick, he obtained a scholarship to attend the Kansas City Art Institute from 1938-40.

Mixer worked in graphic arts in New York, Oklahoma City and Fort Worth, Texas, before moving to San Diego to work in an aircraft manufacturing plant. He returned to Fort Worth in 1943 and joined the US Navy. Stationed in Chicago, he was a visual aids graphic artist.

In his personal time, Mixer painted Western scenes, and his first sales came through a Chicago sporting goods store. Discharged from the service in 1946, he brought his wife, Evelyn Leonard, whom he'd married in 1941, back to Oklahoma, where he built a house and studio near Arcadia/Edmond.

Mixer became a well-known local Western artist during the 1950s and 1960s. Livestock, particularly horses, became his specialty. Briefly retired during the 1980s, Mixer resumed his artistic productions in the mid-1990s, still working from a studio near Arcadia.

Over the years, Mixer and former APHA Executive Secretary Ed Roberts, developed a deep and lasting friendship, so Mixer was commissioned to paint a portrait celebrating the association's 40th birthday in 2002.

The new painting, titled "The Sire," depicts an over stallion standing in majestic watch over his spotted herd, while his tovero mate and overo colt wait nearby. The finished canvas, permanently displayed in the Executive Committee boardroom at APHA headquarters is encased in a custom Mixer-built wood and leather frame.

Mixer's amazing volume of work will continue to celebrate the beautiful form and substance of the Western horse.

APHA's world-class Paint Horse shows will call Fort Worth, Texas, home for five more years

FORT WORTH—The American Paint Horse Association (APHA) recently signed a new five-year contract with the City of Fort Worth, cementing the 46-year-old breed organization's commitment to hosting world-class shows at premier venues. According to terms of the contract, APHA will host both the summer World Championship Paint Horse show, plus the new APHA Fall Championship Show in Fort Worth through 2012.

APHA President Carl Thurow and Fort Worth Mayor Mike Moncrief ceremonially signed the agreement at the Will Rogers Memorial Center (WRMC) in Fort Worth, Texas, where the shows will be held. The inaugural APHA World Championship was held at WRMC in 1984 and has been held at the complex for 18 out of the last 20 years.

"The American Paint Horse Association started out in 1962," Thurow said, "with only a few dozen people and their treasured Paint Horses. Today, we've registered over 928,000 horses. In a few years our total will be 1 million Paints registered.

"For many years, the World Championship Paint Horse Show in Fort Worth has been the place where we've spotlighted the very best American Paint Horses," continued Thurow. "I think the relationship has been great for both Fort Worth and for the American Paint Horse Association. We're happy to continue our tradition of bringing the most talented and beautiful Paint Horses to Fort Worth, Texas, for our world-class Paint Horse shows. The city is a great host."

The two-week APHA World Championship Paint Horse Show's annual impact on Fort Worth's economy is approximately \$13 million.

More about the World Championship Paint Horse Show

The World Championship Paint Horse Show and its predecessor, the National Championship Paint Horse Show, have showcased the talents of the colorful Fort Worth-based breed since 1963.

This year, World Championship Paint Horse Show exhibitors will compete for more than \$400,000 in prize money, buckles, saddles, trailers, and other awards, along with coveted World Championship titles. It will be held at Will Rogers Memorial Center in Fort Worth June 21–July 5.

Last year, APHA welcomed 1,671 Paint Horses owned by people from 47 U.S. states, Canada, the Czech Republic, the Netherlands, the United Kingdom and Germany for its World Show.

In 2007, the show logged 4,219 entries—including 1,242 Youth, 1,362 Open, 1,390 Amateur and Novice Amateur, 207 Futurity and 18 specialty class entries.

In addition to the World Show's continued presence in Fort Worth, the American Paint Horse Association will be adding another world-class event to its line-up this fall from November 6–15 at the Will Rogers Memorial Center. The APHA Fall Championship Show will feature world championship, sweepstakes and challenge classes as well as 10 special classes known as slot classes, which will pay out an estimated \$600,000 in added cash. A select championship Paint Horse sale will also be held in conjunction with the competition.
