

2008 Premium List Rules

MAKE ALL CHECKS PAYABLE TO **ZONE ONE**. Checks will be deposited promptly -
NO POST DATED CHECKS. There will be a \$50 fee assessed for EACH time a check is returned by the bank.

1. An entry in the Zone One Zone-O-Rama is considered an entry under ALL judges.

2. **Exhibitor Responsibility:** SC-160.E - Exhibitors are responsible for being knowledgeable of and following the current rules, completing entry forms legibly and accurately, reporting to the gate promptly and being considerate of other exhibitors and show management. Additionally, exhibitors, owners and trainers are responsible to be knowledgeable of **Rule SC-085.A** Drugs and Medications, forbidden and conditionally permitted substances. Conditionally permitted substances require a complete medication report be filed with show office. **Inhumane treatment of animals on the grounds will not be tolerated. Rule SC-075. Proper action WILL be taken.**

3. The Show Secretary or office staff **MUST** inspect the registration papers (or copies of) on each horse entered (except current year foals). Entries shall be made in the name of the recorded owner. Geldings with stallion papers will be disqualified if not corrected before show results are processed at APHA. **SC 175.G, Pg. 99.**

4. To enter the broodmare class, exhibitors **MUST** show a current year APHA eligibility ID card OR complete an application for an APHA eligibility ID card and return it to the Show Secretary *before* entry in the class.

5. To enter Amateur or Novice Amateur classes, you **MUST** present a current year APHA Membership Card, an Amateur or Novice Amateur card, and own your horse according to **Rule AM 015, Pg 205.**

6. **All Youth must have a present a current AjPHA membership card. Novice Youth** must present a current Novice Youth Card from APHA in order to enter any Novice Youth Class, **Rule YP-205, Pg. 260. Additionally,** Novice Youth may cross enter into the age appropriate Youth Class. ALL youth exhibitors must have an AjPHA membership card (exception being Leadline and Walk/Trot).

7. **All Open Exhibitors must present a current APHA membership card.** The condition of submitting entries or the first entry into the show ring of a horse or exhibitor shall be deemed as acceptance of the *APHA* and *NCHA Official Rule Books* and the *Zone One General Rules*.

8. The final right to settle all questions or disputes arising incidentally to the Zone One Zone-O-Rama is reserved to the Show Management and all exhibitors, owners and trainers as a condition of admission give unqualified consent to such methods of settlement and agree in advance to be bound thereby.

9. Individual class entry registration will close **TWO (2)** classes prior to entry of that class.

10. Cattle reservations **MUST be made by August 1, 2008.**

11. Show management may combine or split classes according to APHA rules **SC 185.G, Pg. 103, AM 080.B, Pg. 212 and YP 075.b, Pg. 239.** If classes are combined to make an APHA point class, buckles will be given for the highest placing Junior & Senior Horse, 13 & Under, 14-18, Classic & Master Amateur.

12. Anyone withdrawing (scratching) from a class after entering shall forfeit their entry fee in accordance with **RULE SC-185.A.**

13. **Exhibitors/owners competing for Zone One Awards are responsible for entering the correct classes to qualify for all awards. Award qualifying class lists will be available at the show.**

14. **HIGH POINT ELIGIBILITY:**

ZONE ONE SUPER HORSE & RESERVE - OPEN, AMATEUR AND YOUTH - The Horse must compete in the appropriate halter class and in at least three of the appropriate categories listed in the **APHA 2008 Rule Book**. Amateur/Novice Amateur: all classes count with one rider/one horse combination. **EXCEPTION:** only one class per division will count for each individual. If you are eligible for Novice Amateur or Novice Youth, the novice classes will be the only ones to count toward the Super Horse Award.

HIGH POINT YEARLING: The yearling must compete in Yearling Longeline, Yearling In Hand Trail and the appropriate Yearling Halter Classes.

HIGH POINT SOLID PAINT BRED/BREEDING STOCK: Must show in one (1) halter and two (2) performance/riding classes.

HIGH POINT NOVICE YOUTH: One horse/one rider combination (all novice youth classes will count towards awards). Must show in at least three (3) novice youth classes to qualify.

HIGH POINT YOUTH - Walk Trot 5 to 9 Yrs. - 13 & Under - 14 to 18: One horse/one rider combination. Must show in at least three (3) youth performance classes to qualify. All youth classes including halter will count towards awards.

HIGH POINT AMATEUR - Classic & Masters: One horse/one rider combination. Must show in at least (3) three amateur performance classes to qualify. All amateur classes including halter will count towards the award.

HIGH POINT NOVICE AMATEUR - One horse/one rider combination. All novice amateur classes will count towards the award. Must show in at least three (3) Novice Amateur classes to qualify.

HIGH POINT JR & SR WESTERN & ENGLISH HORSE - to qualify a horse must compete in three or more: Western (for Western High Point)/English (for English High Point) Performance Classes (Jr-Sr or All Ages). Pleasure Driving will count for English High Point. Halter will NOT count for either High point.

15. **Ties for All Around Horse and High Points** will be broken using the following:

1. The horse that earns the most firsts.
2. The horse that places the most times.
3. The flip of a coin.

16. **HIGH POINT & RESERVE HIGH POINT HALTER STALLION, MARE & GELDING AWARDS** will be calculated as follows: Only the Grand and Reserve placings will count. Grand will receive 2 points and Reserve will receive 1 point. Ties will be broken by the most Grands being the winner unless that is also a tie, then the winner of the most Grands and Reserves will receive the award.

17. **HIGH POINT AND SUPER HORSE AWARDS WILL NOT BE GIVEN OUT OR AVAILABLE UNTIL ONE (1) HOUR AFTER THE LAST QUALIFYING CLASS. Awards MUST be picked up by the end of the show or will be forfeited.**
